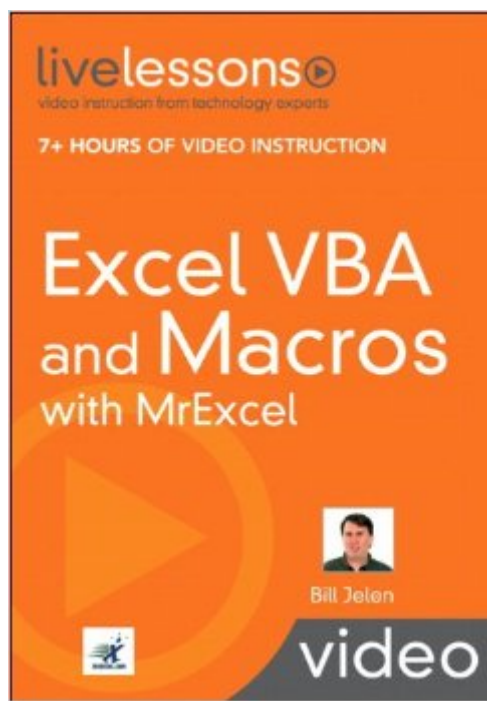

This book is one that I would consider to be intermediate level. It would be pretty useless to someone who has never seen or used Excel. On the other hand it is not nearly as advanced as would be needed by a true expert. Specifically it assumes that the reader uses Excel for perhaps 20 hours a week and has gotten to the point where he has discovered that writing a custom program or macro would be of assistance in performing his job. At the VBA/Macro level, this is a pretty basic level book. It starts with how to turn on the Developer tab and follows this with several lessons on getting started with customizing Excel. After that it goes into the description of several macros. Most of these will not be what you are looking for, but there's a pretty good chance that a few of them will be just about what you need. Perhaps you'll need to modify them a bit, but that's what the book is all about. The format of the book is something new. There's a printed paper, dead tree book, but it's fairly small - neglecting the table of contents and other Roman Numeral pages it's only 125 pages long. But the main part is a DVD which contains some 50 lessons. This gives a combination of written, displayed, and spoken words. All in all, there is about eight hours of discussion on the disk. It's a good way to learn the subject.

I've dabbled in VBA but decided that I wanted to learn it once and for all. I just finished this DVD/book and I believe it has given me an excellent foundation in VBA. It covers all the basics to the point that I feel like I can put my newfound knowledge to use immediately. In fact, after Lesson

38 (out of 50) I wrote a macro to filter (with advanced filter) a membership list, sort it, create a new workbook and copy certain fields to it and save the new workbook. In the past the guy that maintains the list would e-mail me the updated list and ask me to sort, filter and print out the revised list. Now I can just have him run the macro and I won't need to be involved at all. I really like the DVD format as well. BTW - Bill Jelen, the author, also has a great podcast.

I have a library full of computer help books on a myriad of topics from programming to program management. My usual practice when learning a new concept is to find a couple of the best books on the subject and then work my way through them. I invariably spend hours searching the books for that one missing tidbit that completes my understanding of a process or practice. That is, until now. The livelessons series is an awesome way to get the most important training information right up front. In "Excel VBA and Macros with Mr Excel," author Bill Jelen walks through 50 critical macro creation skills, shortcuts, and best practices. The DVD contains over 7 hours of instruction that outshines any book on the subject! Even better is the outstanding value of this product. Any class or seminar easily costs over a hundred dollars and is only a one time event. I'm sold on video training, especially as designed by the folks at QUE livelessons. I may still purchase additional reference books for obscure details, however, with video training I'll be operationally effective much more quickly.

I highly recommend. I am new to macros, for such a minimum charge, you get a wealth of introduction and knowledge. The person in my office spoon fed me and seem to never really explain. So those who need a good intro at minimum expense so that you can go on to actually perfect the knowledge, go for it! Buy it!

This is a wonderful course. Very clear, step-by-step presentation. I have only three small quibbles: 1. The image cannot be changed to a full screen. 2. The introduction of errors in the code. To be sure, they are fixed later but they annoy me to the point where I pay less attention. 3. I never want to hear, "Let's get started." again. Worth every penny....Bob

Editing previously written macros has been fairly easy, while creating macros from scratch has been time consuming. I have several Excel VBA references in print and have used the free online training courses from Microsoft. Those types of products work pretty well, but the part that was missing for me was a real course-type presentation of the material, where it starts out with some of the basics and progresses into organized application of the parts. This product logically presents the topic, and presents step-by-step examples of how to create "good" macros. The supporting Excel files for each lesson are very helpful as well. Bill Jelen is a dynamic presenter and the videos are extremely well done. Finding a knowledgeable person who can also be a captivating presenter and instructor is such a rare find.
